


Jesus College Boat Club Cambridge University

Cambridge University Boat Club is one of the most successful boat clubs in the world. Competing against Oxford annually in the world famous boat race, the club has a reputation for competing at the highest level. Cambridge rowers regularly go on to compete at U23 and Olympic level and the distinctive blue can be seen in almost any high level crew.

The University Boat Club consists of several constituent clubs, all who race their counterparts at Oxford; the Men's and Women's side and both heavyweight and lightweight squads. All use the brand new facilities at Ely and make use of state of the art coaching and equipment.



Jesus College is one of the constituent colleges of the University of Cambridge, and is the most successful on the river. The college has a hard earned reputation for sporting excellence and for generating and supporting athletes through university squads. Almost every year there are multiple rowers involved in the university men's or women's boat clubs. For example, the previous two Women's President were both Jesus members.



Support for Rowers

The number of athletes involved in the university squads is no accident. There are a number of provisions and facilities in place to support athletes through this process:

- Financial support to cover costs of rowers in the university squads. This includes extra tenancy, kit, travel, etc.
- Full time dedicated head coach in the college boat club to help develop to the technical standard required.
- Unparalleled fleet of boats, ranging from singles right through to new 8s, largely of Fillipi or Empacher make.
- Comprehensive free to use gym and ergo room, comprising extensive weights equipment, 16 ergs and 3 spin bikes.
- On site college physio to help deal with any injuries or issues (unique amongst Cambridge Colleges).
- Heavily subsidised annual winter training camp in Mequinenza, Spain.
- No membership or subscription fees, and heavily discounted kit and equipment.
- Guaranteed accommodation a few minutes cycle away from both the Jesus Boathouse and University
 Goldie Boathouse for all years of study.
- The college grounds are by far the closest to the boathouses of all the colleges, making the early mornings a little more bearable.

The college itself has a university wide reputation for sport without compromising the academic standards. This means that the students at the college are all like minded generating a very cohesive community.

Recent examples of people who have progressed from a school level include CUWBC President 2016, Hannah Roberts of Chester, Goldie member 2016 Will Jones of Latymer and 2017 President Tim Nugent of Hampton.
